## CITY OF WATFORD CITY CITY COUNCIL MEETING July 10, 2023

Minutes of the regular City Council meeting held on July 10, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall. Present were Mayor Phil Riely and Council Members Bethany Devlin, Kenny Liebel, Lance Renville, Steve Sanford, and Chelsea Bulzomi. (Matt Beard arrived at 7:15 p.m.) Also present was City Administrator Curt Moen, City Auditor Peni Peterson, and City Attorney Wyatt Voll. Mayor Riely called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council Member Sanford moved to approve the July 10, 2023 meeting agenda, as presented. Motion seconded by Council Member Liebel and carried unanimously.

Council Member Devlin moved to approve the minutes of the city council meetings held June 5 and June 14, 2023. Motion seconded by Council Member Sanford and carried unanimously.

Sara Fitzpatrick gave an update on the Roughrider Center.

Travis Rodenhizer and Tony Carmichael gave an update on the Fox Hills Golf Course.

Chief Wellen gave an update on the police department.

Council Member Sanford moved to approve the recommendation from the Planning Commission meeting held June 26, 2023. Approved: Land Use Application – Zone Change submitted by Manuel Gomez and Gladys Perez rezoning 304 17<sup>th</sup> Ave NE (PID 20-00-05450) from A-2 to R-3.
